



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Sink Holes situate on the Path leading from the Canoe Place to Standing Stone on the first Water which run to the S.E. after rising the Hill from the Canoe Nantobill the foot of the Canoe Mountain adjoin & S.W. of George Meyer's (032) in Bane Township, in the County of Bedford. Containing two hundred & thirteen Acres and the usual Allowance of six p. Cent. for Roads &c. Survey (032) the 13th Day of November 1773 for Philip Syng in pursuance of a warrant Dated the 25th Day of June in the ~~same~~ year, by 1773.

The above Warrant is Located adjoining Valentine Leeser on Piny Creek (032) which the owner of the several Warrants taken out the same Day on Piny Creek land when this Warrant & others of his are laid, says was thro' mistake & his no^t understanding English, by which he neglected to Alter the Location, when he found^t

that the Land for which he had at first intended it was applied for by Alexander Douglass which he knew before he went to the office & this appears to be the Surveyor to be the Case. Thomas Smith (032)
