



Surveyed on the eighth day of February 1735 to John Stoneman a tract of land situate on a Branch of Perqueomy-in New-Cowisshoppen begining at a Black Oak a corner of Christian Allowback's land thence by the same South West one hundred & seventy three perches to a post an other corner of S^d Allowback's land thence by the same South East thirty perches to a post thence by Vacant land South West seventy perches to a post thence by Vacant land North West one hundred and thirty perches to a post then-
ce by Vacant land North East two hundred and thirteen perche to a post thence by Vacant land North West fifty perches to a post thence by Vacant-North East one hund-
red perches to a White oak thence by Vacant land south East one hundred and Seventy Eight perches to a post in the line of Valentine Crismores land thence by ye same South West seventy perches to a post thence by ye S^d Christian Allow-
back North West twenty eight perches to ye place of Beginning containing two hundred and thirty eight acres with usual allowance.
