



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Third day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Charles Hunter a tract of Land situate on the East side of Schuykill River in the County of Philad^e Beginning at a Hackery standing on the Bank of said River being a corner of George Clapp's land thence by the same North Seventy degrees East three hundred & twenty perches to a post thence by Vacant land North twenty degrees west one hundred & four perches to a post thence by Vacant land South Seventy degrees west three hundred and twenty six perches to a Hickery standing on y^e Bank of sd^d River thence down the several Courses of the same to the place of Beginning Contain two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six p. cent.
