


James Rose Warrant

A Draught of a Tract of Land situate on the waters of the South West Branch of Dunnings Creek 5^t Clair Township Bedford County containing One hundred and thirty four acres and sixty eight perches with the usual allowance of six per Cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of Land said to contain 477 acres & the allowance. But by accurate Survey agreeable to the lines on the ground it contains 490^{ac} 14^{pc} & alle which tract was surveyed formerly to James Rose in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 3rd day of June A.D. 1763 and Resurveyed the Lines examined and divided off for Anthony Blackbourn Jun^r the 1st day of June 1821
