

A draught of a tract of land called—situate on the Raystown Branch of Juniata five miles above Bedford adjoining & above land of Thomas Kinton in the township and County of Bedford containing two hundred & eighty three acres and the usual allowance of six  $\frac{1}{4}$  cent for roads &c. surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1776 for Allen Rose in pursuance of an Order N° 5122 dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of July 1768 by
