



A Draught of Two Tracts of Land Situate in Upper Soltord Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania. The first Containing fourteen Acres and 137 perches of Land, with the Usual Allowance for Roads. The Second Containing, forty one Acres and 155 perches with the Usual Allowance. Containing together Fifty six Acres and 132 Perches of Land, together with the usual Allowance at Six percent for Roads. That was formerly Surveyed by Edward Scull unto Conrad Schneider, in Pursuance of a Warrant granted unto him by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries, Dated the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of July Anno-1749. Resurveyed by Order of the Surveyor General on the 27<sup>th</sup> February Anno-1765.
