

The above is a draught of a tract of land called Lebanon, situate on Bush-run in Peters township in Washington county; containing seven acres and fifty two perches with the usual allowance. - Surveyed on the 12th day of March 1816, in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Robert Thompson for eight acres, and dated 11th day of December 1815 -

To my certain knowledge the above described land was first settled in the Spring of 1804, and a constant resident settlement has been kept up ever since.

At the time of survey there was a family living in the Cabin that was built when the first improvement was made; there is also about two acres cleared.

There is no opposing claim whatever.
