



The above Draught represents a Tract of Land Situate in  
East Nottingham Township Chester County Containing 132<sup>acres</sup> 10<sup>sq ft</sup>  
& allowance of Six percent & Being a part of a Tract of Land  
Granted to William Porter and laid out in pursuance of two War-  
rants in his name bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> of November 1735 & 23<sup>rd</sup> of  
January 1738 Containing 214<sup>acres</sup> 86 allowance, which was Returned with  
another survey as the property of John Smith the whole containing  
475<sup>acres</sup> 86 allowance. Situate on the Branches of and near Elk River

Surveyed March 17<sup>th</sup> 1815.
