

Resurveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1872 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Enos E. Rogers in trust, also Hezekiah Davis & Lucinda Davis in fact dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of February A.D. 1872.
