



By virtue of a warrant dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March AD. 1819 surveyed the 14 & 15<sup>th</sup> June 1836 to Andrew Storm Administrator of the Estate of John Storm, deceased, and in trust for the heirs of the said dec'd the above described tract of land, situate in Hamilton township (formerly Northampton now) Monroe County, containing three acres one hundred and fifty-four perches and the allowance of six percent &c. Part of this tract is cleared & under fence & the whole in possession of the heirs of the said John Storm dec'd.
