

Jacob Learn | Heirs of John Storm | Conrad Woodling



By virtue of an application dated the 30th day of August
A.D. 1765 surveyed the 14 & 15th June 1836 to Andrew Storm
administrator of the estate of John Storm deceased, and
in trust for the heirs of the said dec'd the above descri-
bed tract of land, situate in Hamilton township (formerly)
Northampton now Monroe County, containing seventy
eight acres one hundred and forty-seven perches
and the allowance of six per cent &c. being part of a larg-
er tract of one hundred and sixty-six acres, one hund-
red and fifty six perches of land with the allowance.
Originally surveyed to Henry Alshouse. On this tract are a
dwelling-house, barn and other out buildings, orchard, and
in possession of the heirs of the said John Storm dec'd.
