The above is a draft of a Survey made the 4th day of April A. D. 1829. in pursuance of two Warrant granted to Richard Whitehead, and John Wharton, dated the 14th day of April A. D. 1792. and embracing a part of each Survey on said Warrants. And also in pursuance of an order of the Board of Property, to Resurvey. According to Kerrs lines. dated the 11th day of March A. D. 1829. Situate on the Mahoning Creek, in Mahoning Township Mercer County and State of Pennsylvania. Containing three hundred and eighty two acres and 151 perches, and the Allowance of Six per cent for Roads. The dotted lines. show the warrant lines, and the parts are numbered and refer to the Margin, for the Warrantees name and Quantity of each embraced in the Survey.
