

A draft of a tract of land situated in Juniata township, Huntingdon county containing one hundred and sixty-five acres, 100 perches and allowance of six per cent - being a part of a larger tract of 323 acres, 131 perches and allowance originally surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to Hannah Worrel, dated the 3td day of August, 1784. This part divided from the residue of said tract on the 9th day of October, 1788, by James Hunter, an assistant of John Canan, then D.S., whose field notes I have this 27th day of July, 1871, at the request of William and Mary Dowling, present owners, examined and approved.
