



These may certify that by virtue of a warrant from the Commiss<sup>r</sup> of Property to me directed bearing date the 14th of ye 2d mo 1702 I resurveyed to Samuel Hall a certain tract of land scituate in Springfield Township in ye County of Chester being parte of a tract of land formerly George Simcocks. Beginning at a black oak in the line of Francis Yarnall thence So. 10 deg. west 69 perches to a popler in sd line thence So. 80 East 107 per to a poste, being the corner of Edmond Cartledges land thence N. 10 East 83 per to a white oak thence N. 80 W. 45 perches in the line of George Maris to a white oak thence So. 10 West 14 perches to a hickory, thence north 80 West 62 perches to the first mentioned black oak Containing 50 acres.
