

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State  
of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785—  
entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the  
Donation lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth,  
and by Order of the Surveyor General with the approbation  
of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> The Supreme Executive Council. I have  
surveyed on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 1785, The above-  
described Tract of Two Hundred acres of Land and al-  
lowance of six  $\frac{1}{4}$  Cent for Roads &c. No XLVII. situate in  
District No 1. on the west side of the Allegany river, in  
Westmoreland County.
