In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State
of Pennsylvania, passed the 24th day of February 1785, entitled
"An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation
lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth; and
by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of
the Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I have
surveyed on the First day of ^{November} ~~October~~ 1785, the above de-
scribed Tract of Two Hundred acres of Land, and allowance
of six percent for roads &c. No. CXXIX. situate in District
No. 1. on the west side of the Allegany river, in the
county of Westmoreland.
