



A Draught of the Land in dispute between Nicholas Leech and Christian Troxel Resurveyed Agreeably to the Order of the Board of Property. The lines 1.2.3.4.5. the dotted line 6. and 7.8.9 & 10. are the lines expressed in Nicholas Leech's Conveyance and contain 189 1/2 Acres and Allow^e but Christian Troxel agreed to let Nicholas Leech have 20 perches along the 5th line on the Course S. 36. E. and extending to the Black line which contains 197 A^s & Allow^e the remaining part of the (obl.) right is claimed by Christian Troxel containing 35 Acres and 3/10 of an Acre & Allow^e Resurveyed the 26th Day of September 1789.
