



Draught of a tract of Land in Quincy Township, Franklin County, Pa. Containing eight acres and and thirty seven perches and allowance of six per cent for roads, &c. Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Peter Fries, dated May 5<sup>th</sup>, 1851, for eight acres of Land. Surveyed May 20<sup>th</sup>, 1851.

N.B. It appears the above land was once included in a Survey made to Thomas Stoops, dated April 10<sup>th</sup>, 1794, (date of the warrant unknown) but abandoned by their successors, and has been occupied by Jacob Herbaugh, who held the adjoining tract (now sold to Peter Fries) - for about fifty years.
