


FORM NO 1.



A Draught of a Piece of Land, Situate in Lower Chanceford Township in the County of York Containing as above set forth 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ and Allowances, which was Surveyed on the 25th day of April A.D. 1815 by Jacob Kirk late D.S. in Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to the said James Duncan for 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ Dated the 28th Day of June A.D. 1814. Where the letter A stands is said to have been Surveyed for John Lusk in Pursuance of his warrant for 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ Dated the 21st of Feby. 1786. Contained then 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ 41 prs. & allowances which is said was given to the Public &c. Now Surveyed the above on the 8th Day of December A.D. 1831. in Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Ezekiel Barnard for 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ & Dated 19th December A.D. 1770. the Land is unpatented &c. now James Duncan owns &c.
