



The whole of the above tract is an interference of a Tract of 160 as surveyed by Geo. Stevenson D. S. for himself Jan. 29th 1760 in pursuance of a Warrt dated December 16th 1758, and also an interference of a Tract of 82 as 149 ps. surveyed on Warrant dated 23^d feb 173 $\frac{3}{4}$ to C. Eckert patented 31st May 1822. The above Tract was a long time in dispute between the claimants under Stevenson & the Eckerts. When Doct'r Wample came in possession of Eckert's property, the dispute was settled betwixt himself and Abraham Reiff claiming under Stevenson, and Wample remained in possession of the greater part of the above Tract relinquishing along the line A.B. a small strip of land to Reiff.
