By Virtue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the Seal of the Province bearing date the 22^d of 10^{br} 1701 there was Survey'd & Laid out unto James Chivers two hundred acres of land by him seated on presumption in the Manner of Rocklands in the County of Chester (for which he agreed to pay fifty pounds and three years Rent for the time past at one penny Sterling for every acre P. annum) beginning at a Hickory tree standing in Concord line thence running in the said Line north twenty four degrees west ninety five perches to a black oak thence North 81 degrees west in the line of Birmingham Township two hundred thirty nine perches to a White Oak then South South east by Edward Wilbourn's Land two hundred & twenty perches ~~to a post~~ to a post Then East north East by the Widow Budds Land two hundred & Six Poles to ye Place of Beginning
