

At ye Request of Thomas Chandler of ye County of Chester yt we would grant him to take up a certain tract of Land lying on Brandywine Creek formerly laid out to Isaac Helme Junr for 174 acres but afterwards by him thrown up and deserted for 50 acres of wh^c he has agreed to pay to ye Propriet^{rs} use twelve pounds ten shilling w^tin three mo^s after ye date hereof & half a Bushell of wheat yearly forever and for ye Rent or ye yearly Rent of three bushells of wheat forever. These are to authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed to ye sd Thomas Chandler ye aforesd Tract of Land according to ye ancient bounds by wh^c it was at first laid out and make Returns thereof into ye Secretarys office w^t survey in case ye sd Thomas shall comply w^t ye said agreem^t shall be valid otherwise it shall be void & of no effect as if ye same had never been made nor this warrant never granted. Given und^r our hands & Seals of ye sd Province at Philad^{ly} 8th day of ye first month in ye 8th year of ye Reign of Queen Anne over Great Britain & Annoq. Dom 170⁸
