Surveyd and Layd out the 4<sup>th</sup> of December 1716 by a Warr<sup>t</sup> from  
the Commissioners dated the 22<sup>d</sup> of the 9<sup>th</sup> month 1715 unto John Cad-  
wallader of the County of Chester two hundred acres of land (with the  
usual addition of Six P. cent) in the said County Beginning at a black  
oak marked at a corner of Jeremiah Jerman's Land then by the same  
land North West 54 Perches to another black oak Then by a line of mark'd  
trees North East 183 Perches to a third black oak Then South East 204 Perches  
to a post Then by David Cadwallader's Land <sup>S. West</sup> 161 Perches to a post Then North  
West by Vacant Land 150 Perches to a Gum tree Then South West twenty two  
Perches to the place of Beginning.

Returned into the Secretary's Office July the 30<sup>th</sup> 1718
