



The above Tract is an Interference of a Tract of 261 acres and all<sup>e</sup> granted by Patent from T. & R. Penn to Thomas Armor dated 3d July 1772 who sold to Jacob Keagy Whose heirs now own and possess the same. - A suit of Ejectment was, I understand, brought against Abraham Keagy the Elder by the Claimants under-Owings, and after the death of the Owings' Abraham Keagy the elder came into possession of the improvement and has ever since held possession of the Land & removed the Impt. or building - Now in Coronago Town<sup>p</sup>. Witness my hand
