


Peter Backman.



In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by Authority from the Board of Property I have this 10<sup>th</sup> day of April 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and five acres & four tenths and allowance of six per-joining lands of Peter Backman on the heads of Plum Creek. Situate in Mahoning township in the County of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to William Bousman on the 25<sup>th</sup> of January 1779-
