



In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 15th day of May 1828 surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and twelve acres and a half and allowance of six per cent including the Big fork of sugar Creek (now called Little Mahoning) which empties into Mokolbucktilom or Stump Creek (now called Big Mahoning) By virtue of a warrant granted to Thomas Morris on the 13th of February 1775.
