

In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 6th day of March 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and two acres and allowance of six per cent joining land surveyed Richard Porter and Stephen Porter lying east or south east thereof Situate in Mahoning township in the county of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to George Irwin on the 24th of December 1773.
