

In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding land by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of Property I have on the 22nd day of January 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of land containing one hundred and eighty three acres and sixteen perches and allowance of six per cent adjoining lands of John Parks William McKnit Randels Laughlin & others. Situate on the east branch of Altman's run including an improvement about a mile and a half to the northwest of William Smiths in the township of Centre in the county of Indiana. By virtue of a warrant granted to Joseph McNutt on the 4th day of February 1774.
