

In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of Property I have this 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of sixty four acres and seven tenths of an acre and allowance of six percent on the east side of Blacklegs Creek about 8 or 9 miles from the mouth half a mile from an improvement made by James Hamilton up said creek Situate in ~~Conemaugh~~ Conemaugh township Indiana County. By virtue of a warrant granted to William Rankin on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1774.
