

The dotted line and that part of the above diagram including the letters A. B. C. D. E. ~~was surveyed~~ represent a survey made to James McFarland on the 16th day of February 1828 a return whereof is herewith enclosed. This survey has been made upon the land called for by the ~~warrant~~ warrant including James Rodgers improvement on what was in early times called the north branch of Blacklick creek and about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile above the junction of the north & south branch. It will be seen by the date of the above surveys that the land has been previously surveyed and appropriated. Christian Rugh occupies the tract now surveyed to James McFarland and claims under ~~to~~ the title to Samuel Dickson.
