In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of Property I have this 16<sup>th</sup> day of February 1833 surveyed the above described tract of Two hundred and fifty seven acres and fifty eight perches and allowance of six per cent on the forks of Blacklick — about 3/4<sup>th</sup> of a mile above the forks of said creek including James Rodgers improvement extending up the creek & Easterly including a small Spring & McDonalls Impt adjoining lands of James Mitchell John McGrea and others situate in Blacklick township Indiana county. By virtue of a <sup>warrant</sup> ~~location~~ granted to James McFarland on the 23<sup>d</sup> of July 1773.
