


FORM NO 1:



In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations ~~or~~ other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 10th day of May 1828 surveyed the above described tract of land containing two hundred and eighty four acres & a half & allowance of six percent joining John Vanderlin Jr. extending westerly and including coal run & a white oak tree marked I.V.D. Situate in Armstrong township in the county of Indiana by ~~act~~ virtue of a warrant granted to Jonathan Paul the 8 of February 1776.

N.B. That part of the above survey represented by the dotted line and the letter A

B. was surveyed to Alexander McCausland on the 4th of May 1770 By order of the No. 2215.

3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 and that part including the letters C. D. was surveyed to John Latta on order of the 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 the date of the survey I have not got.
