



In pursuance of a Contract of the first of Nov<sup>r</sup><sup>rist</sup> 1827 with the Members of the Board of Property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the authority therein represented. There was surveyed and calculated by virtue of a warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> of Sept: 1773. Granted by the Proprietary Government unto Ephraim Steel, calling for one hundred & fifty ac<sup>e</sup>. The above described tract of land bordered with garrboge. Situate in Plumb township Allegheny County, on the west branch of Turtle creek, containing one hundred fifty two acres & one hundred perches &  $\frac{9}{10}$  of a pr. & allowance of six per cent.
