



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 14 day of May 1828 surveyed the above described tract of three hundred and one acres & eight tenths and allowance including the head of plane creek which empties into Mohulbuckletim or Stump creek (now called the south branch of little Mahoning) in Mahoning township in the county of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to John Shaw the 13<sup>th</sup> of February 1775.
