

In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of Property I have this 10th day of May 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Three hundred and fifteen acres and alluviance of six per cent adjoining lands surveyed on warrant to George Kimmil dated 9<sup>th</sup> Feby. last on the N.W side including coal run a branch of crooked creek downwards & including a whiteoak tree standing at a Springhead marked I.L. By virtue of a warrant dated the 8<sup>th</sup> February 1776 granted to John Vanderin Junr.
