

3rd Sept. 1768
No. 5165.

Draught of a tract of land
Situate in Southampton
Township, Franklin County
Containing in the whole two hundred
and fifteen acres and al-
lowance of six percent for roads &c.

Located in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary Rights &c. By virtue of an Order of Survey dated 20 February 1769, No. 5339, granted to James Finney for 200 a. on the North Side of the South Mountain, joining Thomas Miller, Anthony Maul and William Reynolds in Lurgan Township

Report. The part of the above tract marked A, is covered by a warrant dated the 31 March, 1786, granted to James Peal. The part marked B, is included in a survey of 427 a. 72 & al. Resurvey'd the 19 Augt. 1812 on an order of the Board of Property, dated 4th instant, 1812, and on a warrant to Samuel Blythe dated 3d November 1785, under which which respective titles the land is claimed. The above appears to be the fair location of Finneys order, yet no evidence appears of said order being previously executed.
