By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of George Harland and Thomas Hollingsworth that we would grant them a resurvey on three certain tracts of land severally in their possession the one laid out for one hundred acres belonging to Geo. Harland at ye head of Israel Helm's land, another laid out for five hundred acres to the sd George near Marlboro on Brandywine—and the third laid out to Valentine Hollingsworth for four hundred acres and now in the possession of the sd Thomas: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey truly and exactly with chainmen ^{duly} attested before some Magistrate all the said three tracts according to their true bounds and first lines of survey and make returnis thereof into the Surveyors Office at Philad^{is} where this warrt is to remain and a copy thereof attested by the secretary to be transmitted to thee, who is to take a duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands & ye^e seal of the Province at Philad^{is} the 4th 12^{mo} 1701.
