By virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietary & Governor bearing date ye 22^d of ye 3^d mo. last (directed to me) I hereby certifie into his Secret(bbl.) office, yt I have caused to be surveyed and (obl.) out, ye 13th of ye 4th mo. last, unto William Howell in right of Lewis David purchaser, two hundred ~~one~~ acres of land in ye County of Chester, Beginning at a cornet marked white oak standing on Darby Creek, from thence S. W. b. W. by ye land of Thomas Ellis 320 perches, to a cornet marked post standing by ye road, from thence ^{S.S.E} by a line of marked trees, 100 perches to a cornet marked post, from thence N.E by E. by ye land of Robt Taylor, 320 perches, to a cornet marked white ~~one~~ oak standing on ye said Darby Creek, from thence along ye severall courses of ye said Creek to ye first mentioned white oak and is accordingly entred and record-ed in my office in Philadelphia this 16th of ye 5th moneth 1684.
