



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor's Comm<sup>rs</sup> dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 9<sup>br</sup> 1714. I survey'd to John Grafton a certain tract of land <sup>scilicet north</sup> of Nottingham in the County of Chester.

Beginning at a post in the line of Rich<sup>d</sup> Harrold thence south east by vacant land two hundred & forty perches to a post. Thence north east by y<sup>e</sup> land of William Beal two hundred & ten perches to a Chestnut tree thence north sixty degrees westerly by vacant land two hundred & forty nine perches to a white oak thence south west by y<sup>e</sup> land of the s<sup>d</sup> Richard Harrold one hundred & forty six perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing two hundred and fifty acres with the allowance of six p<sup>cs</sup> Cent.

Survey'd & lay'd out by the Surveyor Generall's order the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1716
