thes forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye sd number of acres  
in ye aforementioned county, at or near the place desired, provided it be not  
taken up, according to ye method of township appointed by me, and  
make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia ye  
21<sup>st</sup> 9br. 1683.
