

By virtue of a warrant under the Hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province dated the 17<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1715 There was surveyd and laid out the 26<sup>th</sup> of the same month and year to Ezekiel Harland two tracts or Parcels of land in the County of Chester. The first Lying on a Branch of Doe run Beginning at a marked Black oak <sup>at</sup> a corner of another tract of the said Ezekiel's land Thence east by the same two hundred twenty two perches to a post Then north by a line of marked trees two hundred and eleven perches to a black oak Then west by vacant land one hundred thirty seven perches to a post Then south south west by a line of marked trees two hundred twenty eight Pches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred twenty four acres with the usual allowance of six acres & cent. The other tract Lying on a small Branch of Pequa Creek Beginning at a corner marked Black oak by Conestogoe road near the head of the said Branch Thence north north west by a line of marked trees one hund<sup>d</sup> twenty two perches to a white oak Then east north east by a line of marked trees two hundred and eighty perches to a Hickory tree Then south south east by a line of marked trees one hundred twenty <sup>two</sup> Pches to a post Then west south west by a line of marked trees two hundred and eighty Pches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres and the customary allowance of six & cent. Surveyd also to the said Ez<sup>t</sup> Harland the first of the 12<sup>th</sup> month 1714<sup>15</sup> by a warrant from the said Commissioners dated the 15<sup>th</sup> of the 7<sup>th</sup> month 1714 a tract of land in the township of Kennel in the said County of Chester being part of six hundred acres formerly taken up by Anthony Weston and Anthony Burgess and by y<sup>m</sup> relinquished Beginning at a black oak marked at a corner of Isaac Taylor's land Thence by Joseph Taylor's land north sixty one degrees west fifty Pches to a post Thence south west by other land of the said Ezekiel Harland three hundred and ninety Pches to a to a post. Then south east by a line
