At the request of Henry Hayes of the County of Chester, That we would grant him to take up a certain tract of vacant land situuate in the said County lying between a tract laid out to the Old Society of Traders and Hilltown on the north side of a tract Surveyed to Abiah Taylor, for which he has agreed to pay in three months after the rate of Twenty marks or thirteen pounds six shillings and eight pence ~~per hundred~~ and one shilling Sterling for a yearly quitrent for each hundred acres the whole containing about four or five hundred acres. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Henry Hayes the said tract of vacant land situuate as aforesaid and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. ~~in case~~ Which survey in case the sd Henry comply with the agree'mt aforesaid Shall be valid otherwise shall be void as if the same had never been made nor this warrt ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 22<sup>d</sup> day of the fourth month A.D. 1713.
