By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Richard Harrold that we would grant him to take up four hundred acres of land in the County of Chester for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors one shilling Sterling for forty Pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorise and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Richard Harrold in the ~~the~~ aforesaid ^{County} according to the method of townships appointed the ~~the~~ quantity of four hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians & make a returne thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Richard Harrold fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province of Philadelphia the fifth day of the ninth month Anno Domini 1714.
