At the request of James Hamner of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up amongst the late surveys made back in the said county the quantity of two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>er</sup> use twenty pounds mony of Pensilvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said James Hamner in the place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said James fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrt ever granted Given under our hands & seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>le</sup> ye 10<sup>th</sup> of 8 br Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1717.
