Upon an agreement this day made with Robert Hodgson & James Hendricks
 both of the County of Chester for two thousand acres of land in one regular tract
 on Contestogoe creek for which they agree to pay to the Proprietor's use two hun-
 dred pounds for the whale and the usual yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling
 for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require them to survey or
 cause to be surveyed unto the said Robert Hodgson & James Hendricks on or near
 the place aforesaid the said quantity of two thousand acres of land in one
 tract that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the
 Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's office which survey
 in case the said Robert & James fulfill the above agreement within three
 months after location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it
 had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given Under our hands and
 seal of the Province at Philadelphia the sixteenth day of ye Twelfth month


