Upper Merion

At the request of Hugh Hughes of ~~Upper Merion~~ that we would grant him to take up at
 a branch of Conestago—the quantity of five hundred acres of land for which he
 agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees ^{of this Province} fifty pounds money of Pensilvania for the
 whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for each hundred acres.
 These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said
 Hugh Hughes at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed
 the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed
 nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the
 Secretary's office which survey in case the said Hugh fulfill the above agreement within
 in three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void
 as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands &
 ye seal of ye Province at Philadelphia ye 1st day of gbr Anno Dom 1718.
