of this Province that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres
of land contiguous and adjoining to those 750 acres lately Surveyed to him in
ye County of Chester for wh^{ch} he hath agreed to pay the sum of fifteen pounds
of the present Currency to the Prop^{rs} use. These are to authorize thee to survey
or cause to be Surveyed to the sd Thomas Haywood the sd quantity of two
hundred and fifty acres of vacant land in the place aforesd and make re-
turns into the Secretaries office. Which survey in case the sd Thomas shall
comply with the agreement aforesd within six months after the date hereof
shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no effect. Given under our hands
& seal of the Province at Philad^{la} the 24th day of 9th 1709.
