Whereas W<sup>th</sup> Hurttly of the County of Chester hath purchased of us two hundred acres of land now vacant at the head of the tract lately purchased by Peter Dix & joy-ning on the land lately taken up by Tho: Witters beyond Brandywine for w<sup>ch</sup> he has agreed to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> use forty pounds upon or before the first day of the tenth month next ensuing: These are to authorize & require thee to survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> W<sup>th</sup> Hurttly in the place afores<sup>d</sup> the said quantity of two hundred acres of land where vacant and not claimed by any other or injuring ye adjoining settlers and make return thereof into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by the Secretary. W<sup>ch</sup> survey in case the s<sup>d</sup> W<sup>th</sup> his Ex<sup>rs</sup> or assigns shall fulfill ye agreem<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> shall be valid otherwise shall be void and of no effect.
