By vertue of a warr^t from Capt. W^m Markham and Com^c dated ye 3^d of ye
 7th mo. 1682. Directed to ye survey^r Generall I do by authority ffrom him certi-
 fie in to ye Secretaryes office yt there was surveyed and laid out ye 4th of ye 7th
 mo 1682. unto Henry Hastings and Richard Buffington four hundred acres
 of land in ye County of Chest^c. Begining at a corn^r spanish oak standing by
markes creek thence ~~south~~ E.N.E. by a line of trees ffour hundred fforty eight
 pches to a corn^r popler tree thence S.S. E. by W^m Woodmansons and Mich-
 ell Isard's land one hundred fforty six pches to a corn^r white oak, ffrom thence
 W.S. W: by a line of trees ffour hundred fifty one pches to a corn^r white oak
 standing by ye aforesaid markes Creek, thence along ye severall Coarses there-
 of to the place of Begining. And is accordingly entred and recorded in ye Survey^r
 General's office at Philadelphia ye 19th R^d M^o 1690.
