Whereas Joseph Helsby, <sup>late</sup> of Kingsley in the County of Chester in the Kingdom of great Britain Carpenter hath produced unto us deeds of lease & release Indented under the hand & seal mannal of the Prop'ry bearing date the second & third days of March in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred eighty & one purporting a grant & released by the sd Prop'ry of two hundred and fifty acres of land in this Province unto John Brown of Kingsley aforesd Tanner his heirs & assignes and also like indentures bearing date the first & second days of the Twelfth month one thous- and seven hundred & ten purporting a grant & release of the sd two hundred & fifty acres of land by John Brown son & heir of the sd John Brown unto the sd Joseph Helsby his heirs & assignes. And the sd Joseph Helsby requesting of us a warrant for the location of the permissons. These therefore are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the sd Joseph Helsby according to the method of townships appointed the full quantity of two hund<sup>d</sup> & fifty acres of land in this Pro- vince. That has not been already surveyed nor taken up, nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands & seal of the sd Province the eighteenth day of the eighth month (at Philad<sup>la</sup>) in the year of our Lord 1711. Edw<sup>e</sup> Shippens
